

Tech to Gov Cheat Sheet

Translating Government Titles and Tech Roles

Navigating the tech sector roles and learning how those roles and skills translate to government job types and titles can be overwhelming. Most government roles abide by established civil service rules in order to protect the integrity and fairness of the civil service, which often makes it hard to translate to the fast-evolving tech roles and disciplines in the private sector. The list below is not inclusive and may not be equally applied across all federal jobs and agencies, but hopefully it gives tech candidates exploring government positions a place to start. Candidates should still look at each job posting to determine if the description meets their experience.

2210 - Information Technology Management

This series covers positions that manage, supervise, lead, administer, develop, deliver, and support information technology (IT) systems and services. This series covers only those positions for which the paramount requirement is knowledge of IT principles, concepts, and methods; e.g., data storage, software applications, networking.

Series has 4 basic titles and 11 parenthetical titles. Positions may have any combination of titling.

Basic Title	Description
IT Cybersecurity Specialist	Cybersecurity work involves the security of and operations in cyberspace and encompasses the full range of threat reduction, vulnerability reduction, deterrence, international engagement, incident response, resiliency, and recovery activities, including computer network operations, information assurance, diplomacy, military, and intelligence missions as they relate to securing the global information and communication infrastructure.
IT Program Manager	Work that involves managing one or more major multi-year IT initiatives of such magnitude they must be carried out through multiple related IT projects. The IT Program Manager leads, coordinates, communicates, integrates and is accountable for the overall success of the program, ensuring alignment with critical agency priorities. They are responsible for ensuring the work efforts achieve the outcome specified within the agency's business strategy, including appropriate strategic, life cycle management and capital IT investment plans. Work includes project selection, prioritization, evaluation and monitoring, cost schedule management, risk management, quality management and resource allocations.
IT Project Manager	Work that involves directly managing information technology projects to provide a unique service or product.
Information Technology Specialist or IT Specialist	Work that involves developing, delivering, and supporting IT systems and services.

Use the parenthetical specialty titles defined below with the basic title to further identify the duties and responsibilities performed and the special knowledge and skills needed.

Policy and Planning	Work that involves a wide range of IT management activities that typically extend and apply to an entire organization or major components of an organization. This includes strategic planning, capital planning and investment control, workforce planning, policy and standards development, resource management, knowledge management, auditing, and information security management.	 enterprise resource planner IT policy and planning analyst IT program management specialist IT auditor
Enterprise Architecture	Work that involves the analysis, planning, design, implementation, documentation, assessment, and management of the enterprise structural framework to align IT strategy, plans, and systems with the mission, goals, structure, and processes of the organization.	 chief or senior enterprise architect enterprise architect information technology architect
Security (Infosec)	Work that involves ensuring the confidentiality, integrity, and availability of systems, networks, and data through the planning, analysis, development, implementation, maintenance, and enhancement of information systems security programs, policies, procedures, and tools.	 information systems security analyst/ specialist information systems security officer network security officer information assurance analyst/ specialist

Systems Analysis	Work that involves applying analytical processes to the planning, design, and implementation of new and improved information systems to meet the business requirements of customer organizations.	 systems analyst business analyst solutions architect
Applications Software	Work that involves the design, documentation, development, modification, testing, installation, implementation, and support of new or existing applications software.	 programmer programmer analyst applications developer software engineer software developer software quality assurance specialist
Operating Systems	Work that involves the planning, installation, configuration, testing, implementation, and management of the systems environment in support of the organization's IT architecture and business needs.	 systems programmer systems software programmer systems engineer systems software engineer

Classify such positions in other occupational series requiring paramount knowledge of the subject matter involved.

^{**} NOTE: Positions responsible for assisting customers in installing and configuring desktop systems and commercial off-the-shelf software and resolving problems in accordance with established procedures, that do not meet the criteria for coverage in the 2210 series, may be found in the Computer Clerk and Assistant Series, 0335 or other related one-grade interval series.
