

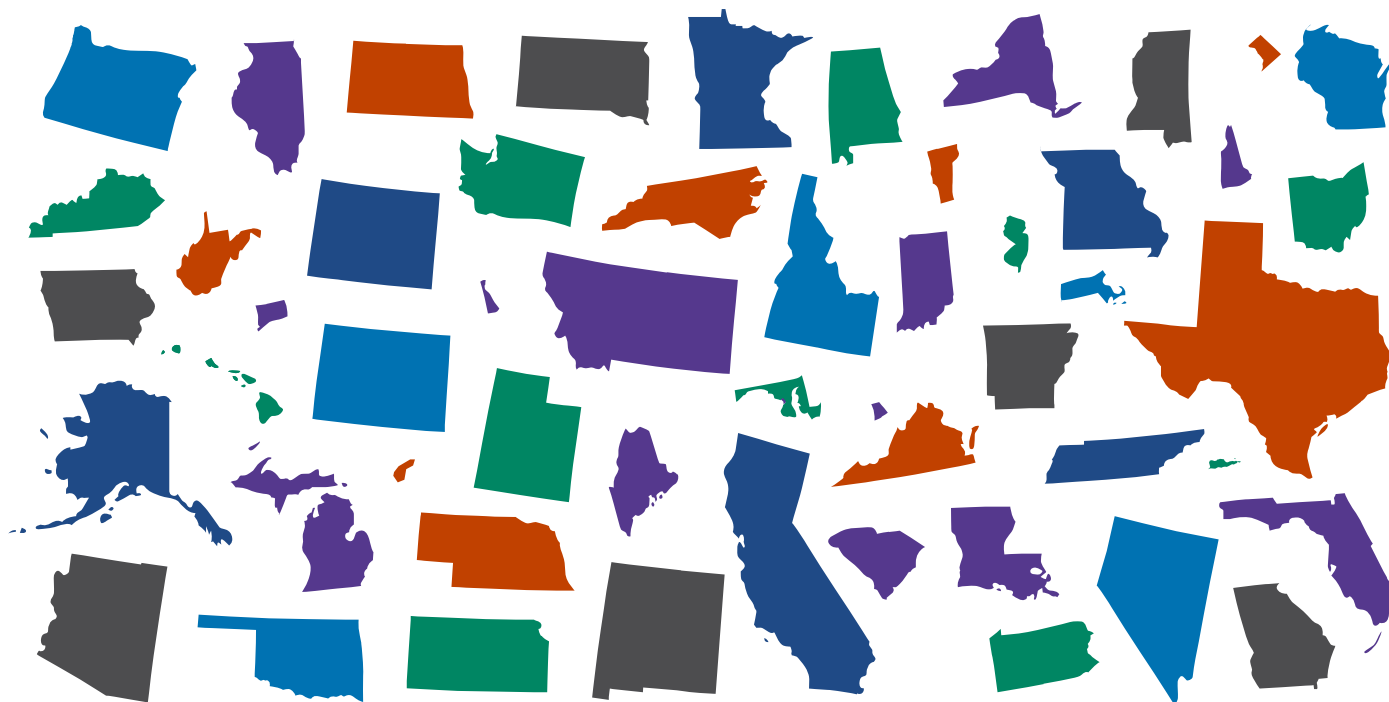

Introduction

Welcome to the 16th edition of the *Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) State Options Report*.

This report summarizes 21 SNAP policy options and waivers and categorizes the 53 SNAP State agencies according to the options and waivers they have implemented. SNAP State agencies include all 50 States, the District of Columbia, Guam, and the Virgin Islands. The information in this report is current as of October 1, 2023. The Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) and Westat developed this report using extant data from the Federal fiscal year (FFY) 2024 SNAP State Plans of Operation, approved waivers, and a review of State legislation and policy.

SNAP statutes, regulations, and FNS waiver authority provide State agencies with the ability to adapt the program to best meet the needs of eligible households in their jurisdictions. State agencies may implement certain options and waivers within specific geographical areas or for specific populations, so long as they are applied consistently and comply with Federal civil rights laws. These policy options, waivers, and administrative choices help State agencies simplify program administration and operations while promoting program access, service delivery, effective stewardship of government resources, and program integrity.

This report has three parts:

- The **Statutory and Regulatory Citations** reference page provides statutory and regulatory citations for each policy option. This page guides the reader to relevant provisions of the Food and Nutrition Act of 2008 and Title 7 of the Code of Federal Regulations.
- The **SNAP Option Profiles** section describes each policy option, the choices within that option, and a map of the State agencies that have selected the option.
- The **SNAP State Agency Profiles** section provides a State-by-State summary of the options each State agency has chosen.

This edition of the report includes several changes from earlier editions. Hex maps replace standard maps to provide a more visually consistent presentation of the data, and several options have been revised to communicate the different aspects of the options more clearly.

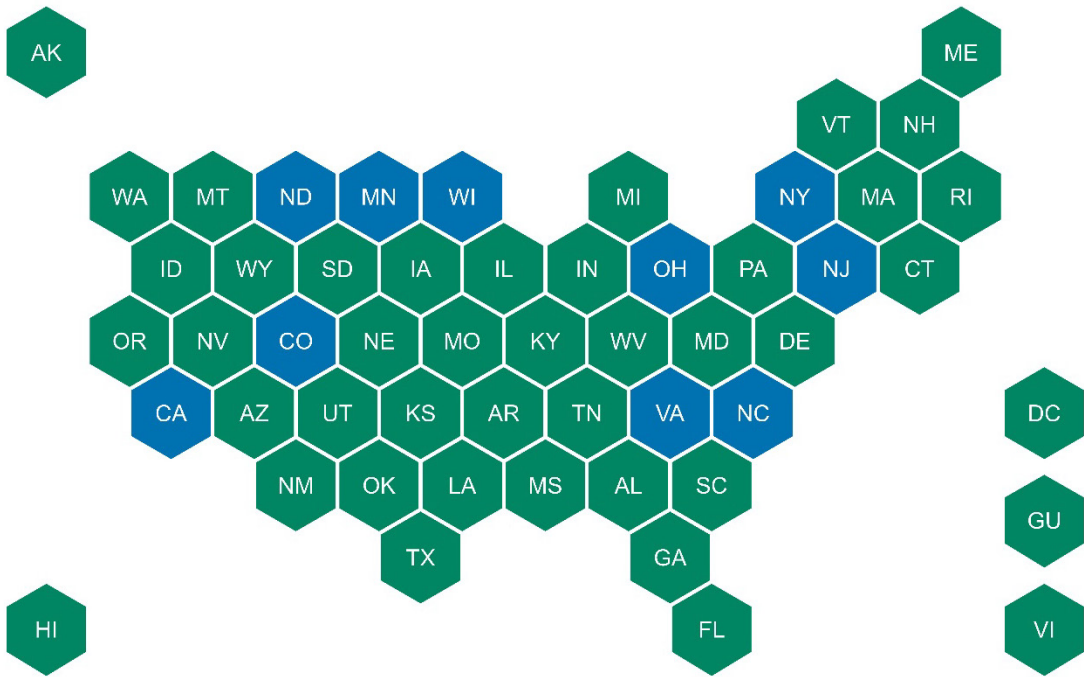
SNAP Option Profiles

Program Administration

Section 3(s) | Section 11(d) | 271.2 “State agency” | 272.2(c)(2)(ii)

State agencies have flexibility to adapt their organizational structure to administer SNAP according to their unique circumstances and the needs of their residents. State agencies may opt to centralize or decentralize their administration of SNAP. For example, State agencies may choose to administer SNAP at the State level or at the regional, district, or county level.

Certification Period Lengths

Section 3(f) | 273.10(f) | 273.12(a)(5)

State agencies have flexibility in how long they certify SNAP households, within certain limits and dependent on household circumstances. State agencies may certify households in which all adult members are 60 or older or have disabilities for a maximum of 24 months and all other households for a maximum of 12 months. Some State agencies certify nearly all households for the same length of time, while others certify households for varying lengths of time according to household circumstances.

The table below illustrates the most common certification period lengths of 4, 6, 12, and 24 months. Some State agencies may certify households for different periods than those listed below depending on household circumstances. The table does not include certification period lengths assigned under the Elderly Simplified Application Project (ESAP) or transitional benefits alternative (TBA); see those SNAP Option Profiles for more information.

Treatment of Self-Employment Income

Section 5(m) | 273.11(b)(3)

When determining a household's self-employment income, State agencies must exclude the costs of doing business. State agencies may choose among two general options for calculating excluded self-employment income:

- use actual costs; or
- use another method, such as the standard amount the State agency uses for its Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program or a simplified self-employment expense method approved by FNS, which may include different methods for different types of self-employment.

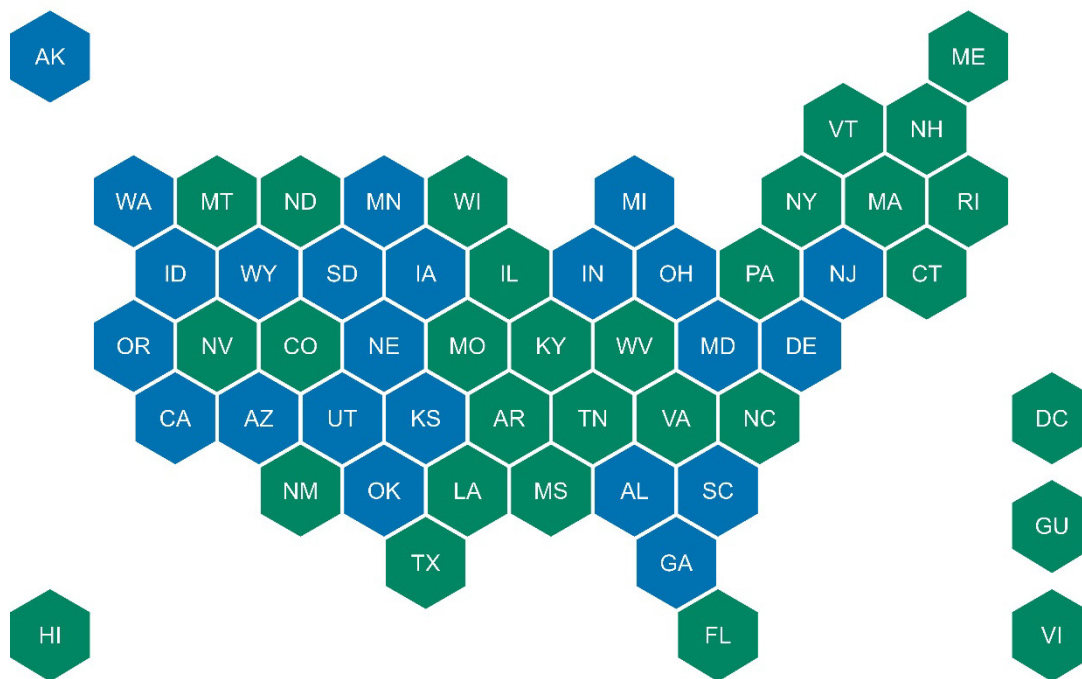

Standard Utility Allowances

Section 5(e)(6)(C) | 273.9(d)(6)(iii)

State agencies that use Standard Utility Allowances (SUAs) in place of actual utility costs can opt to make their SUA mandatory for households that qualify for it. If a State agency takes this option, it must not prorate SUAs for households that share living space and heating or cooling expenses.

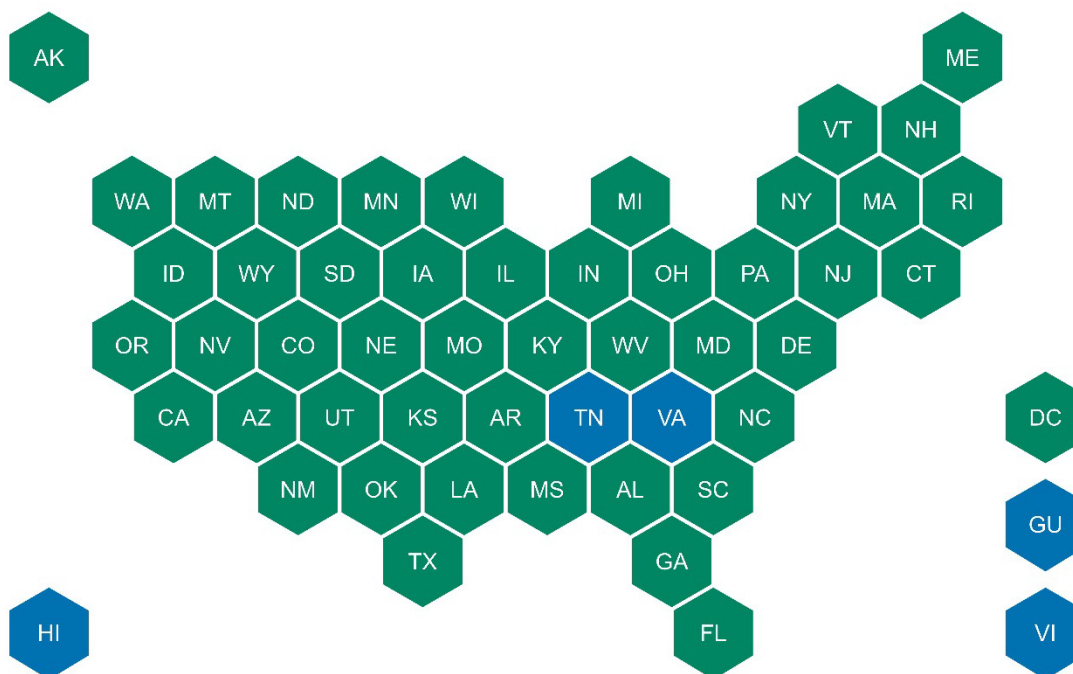

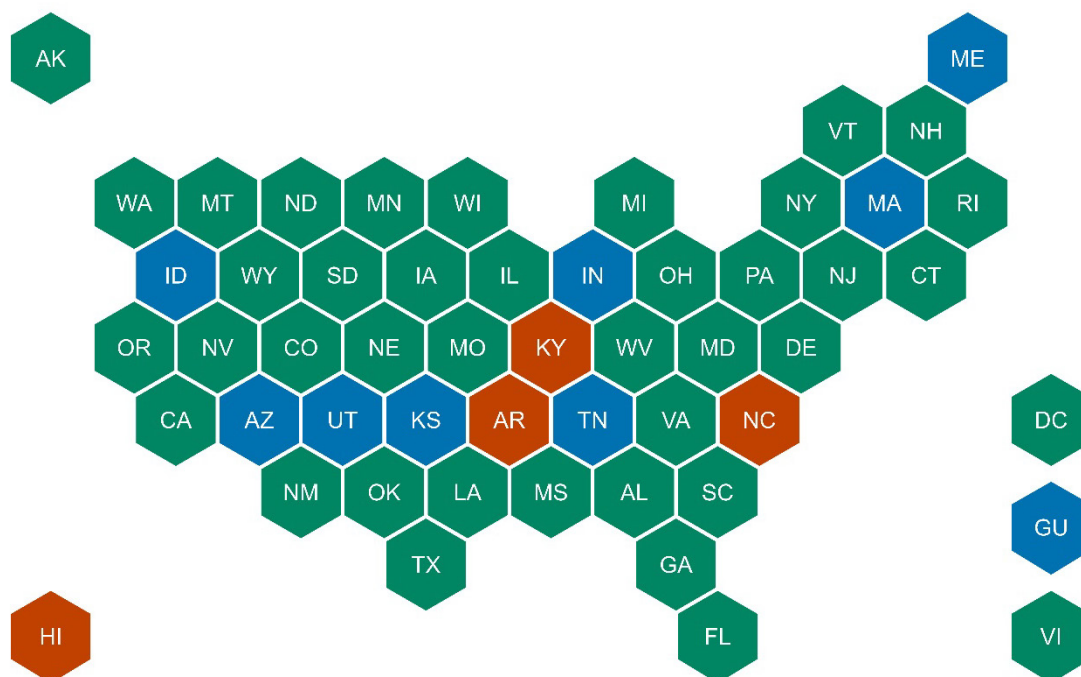

Treatment of Income and Deductions of Ineligible Noncitizens: Post-PRWORA

Section 6(f) | 273.11(c)(3)(ii)

Although ineligible noncitizens cannot receive SNAP benefits, their income is considered when determining the eligibility and benefit amount for other members of the household. If the noncitizen household member is an ineligible noncitizen because of PRWORA, State agencies may count all but a prorated share or none of the individual's income and deductions. The chosen option must be implemented consistently across the State, Territory, or District and only applies to the income of the ineligible noncitizen.

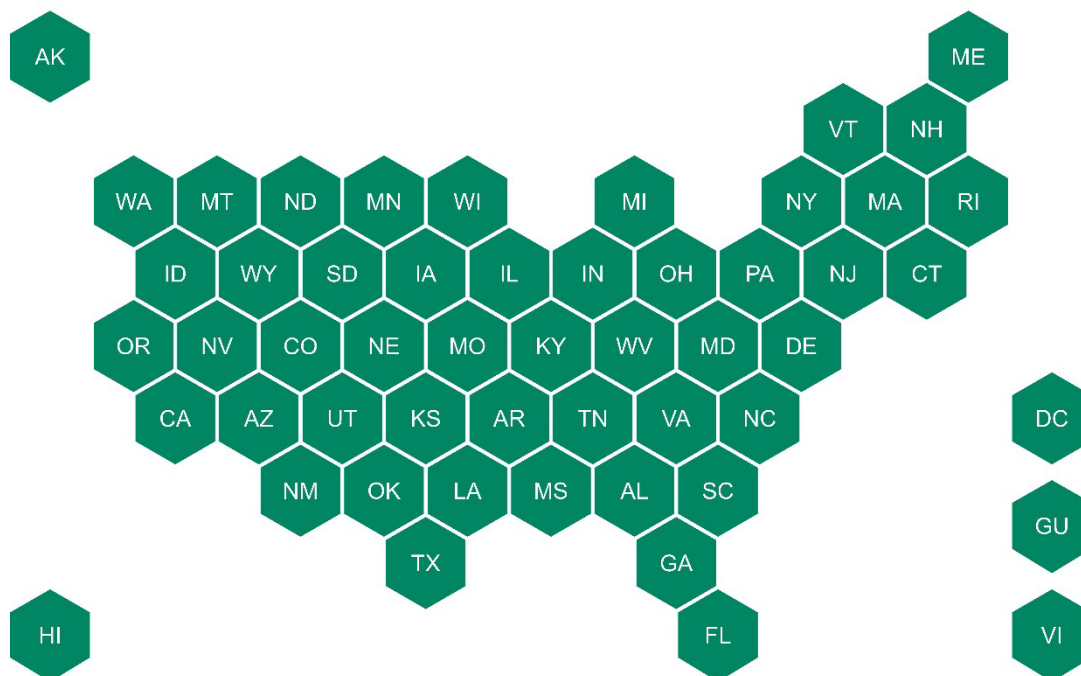

Treatment of Child Support Payments

Section 5(e)(4) | 273.9(c)(17) | 273.9(d)(5)

State agencies have the option to treat legally obligated child support payments made to nonhousehold members as an income exclusion rather than a deduction. State agencies that do not use this option must treat legally obligated child support payments made to nonhousehold members as a deduction.

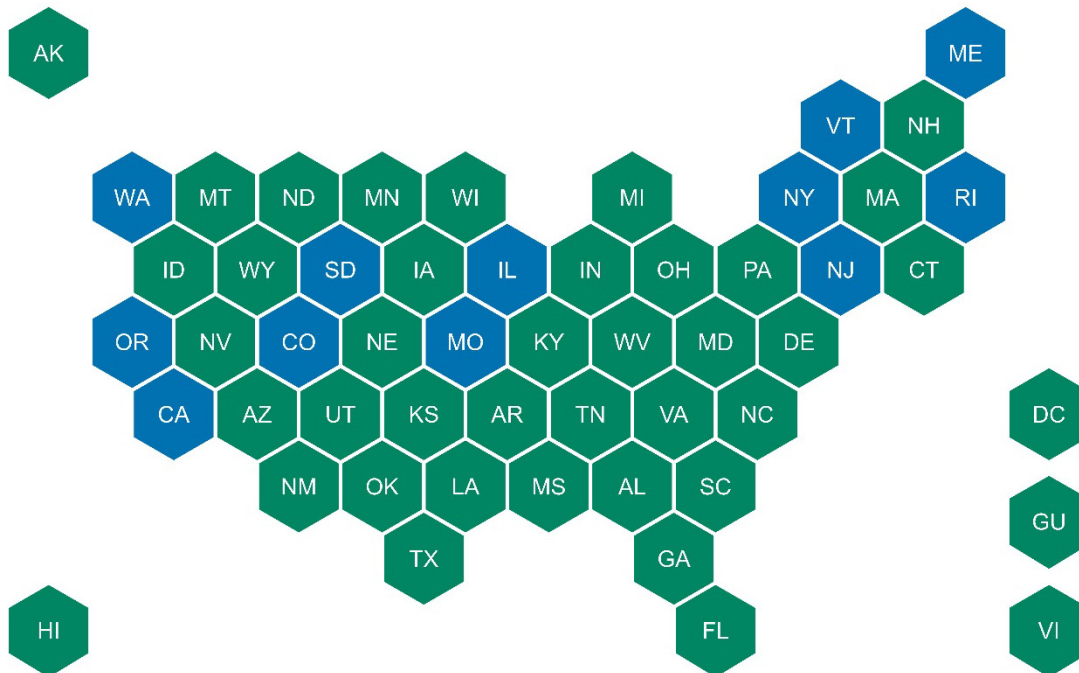

Child Support–Related Disqualifications

Section 6(l)-(n) | 273.11(o) | 273.11(p) | 273.11(q)

State agencies have the option to disqualify household members who fail to cooperate with child support enforcement agencies without good cause. Under this option, State agencies may choose to apply the disqualification to custodial parents, noncustodial parents, or both custodial and noncustodial parents. State agencies also have the option to disqualify household members who are in arrears with court-ordered child support payments.

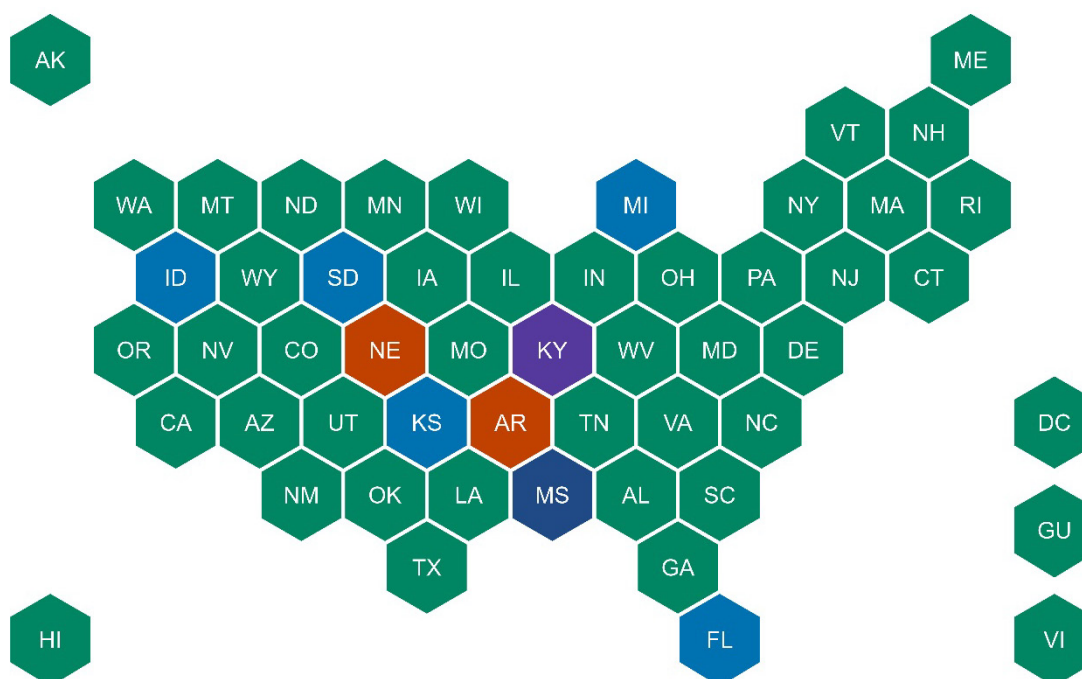

Comparable Disqualifications

Section 6(i) | 273.11(k)

State agencies may disqualify a household member who fails to perform actions required by certain Federal, State, or local means-tested public assistance programs. State agencies have the option to apply this provision to one or more such programs and may select which disqualifications within a program apply to SNAP recipients. However, SNAP rules set specific limitations. The following are examples of such limitations:

- State agencies may only disqualify the individual who committed the violation, even if the entire household was disqualified under the rules of the other program.
- State agencies may not disqualify an individual for failing to perform a purely procedural requirement.
- State agencies may not disqualify an individual who is not receiving SNAP, including applicants for SNAP.

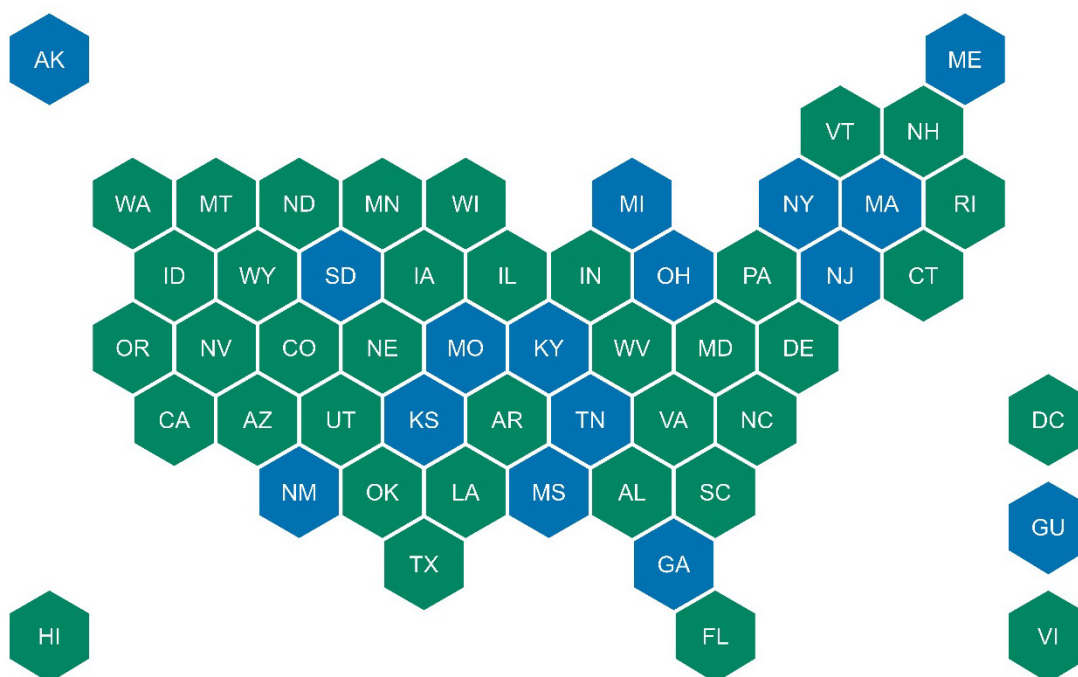

Drug Felony Disqualifications

PRWORA Section 115 | 273.11(m)

Federal law permanently disqualifies household members convicted of a Federal or State felony offense involving the possession, use, or distribution of a controlled substance after August 22, 1996. However, Federal law allows State legislatures to opt out of the disqualification or modify the disqualification to impose a less severe restriction. The following are examples of modified disqualifications:

- Limit the circumstances in which the permanent disqualification applies (such as only when convictions involve the sale of drugs).
- Require the convicted individual to comply with the terms of their parole.
- Require the convicted individual to pass drug testing.
- Require the convicted individual to participate in a drug treatment program.

This information reflects laws enacted by State legislatures and the absence of such laws.

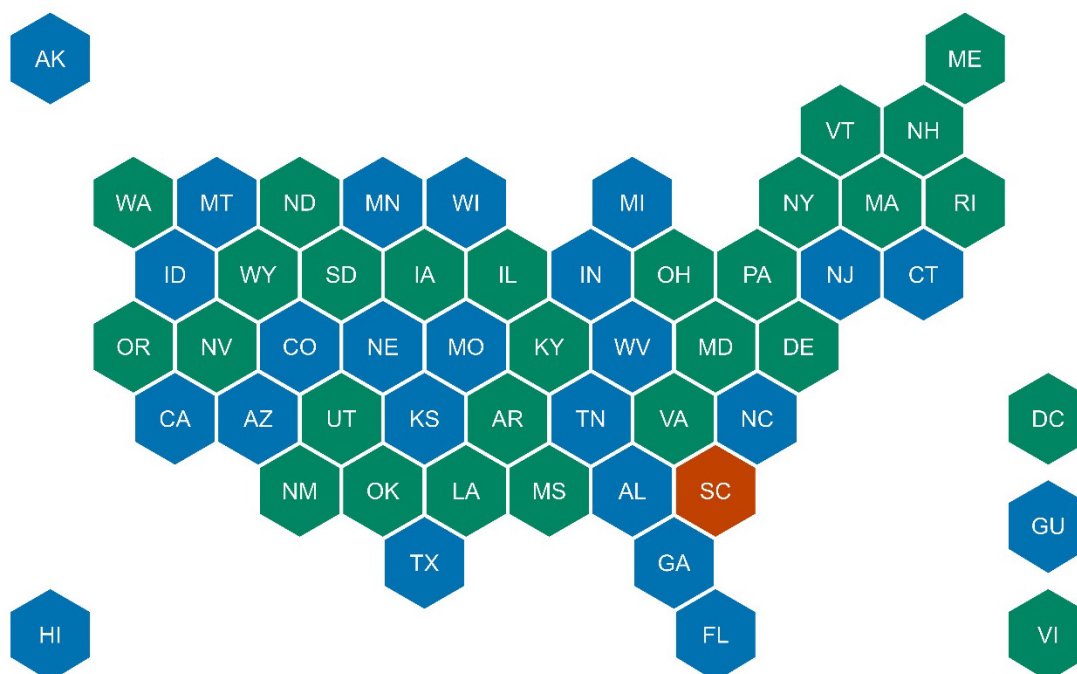

Work Requirements: Disqualification Period Policy

Section 6(d)(1)(C) | 273.7(f)(2)

SNAP household members aged 16–59 must comply with the SNAP general work requirements, which include work registration and a requirement to accept a suitable job if offered, restrictions on voluntarily quitting a job or decreasing hours, and potentially mandatory participation in SNAP Employment and Training (E&T) or workfare. People are exempt from the general work requirements if they are facing physical or mental barriers to work, caring for a young child or incapacitated person, employed at least 30 hours, or participating in a work program or school half-time or more.

Nonexempt individuals who fail to comply, without good cause, are disqualified until they comply for a minimum of 1 month for the first instance, 3 months for the second, and 6 months for the third. State agencies have the option to establish extended disqualification periods of up to 3 months for the first instance, up to 6 months for the second, and a date set by the State agency or permanently for the third.

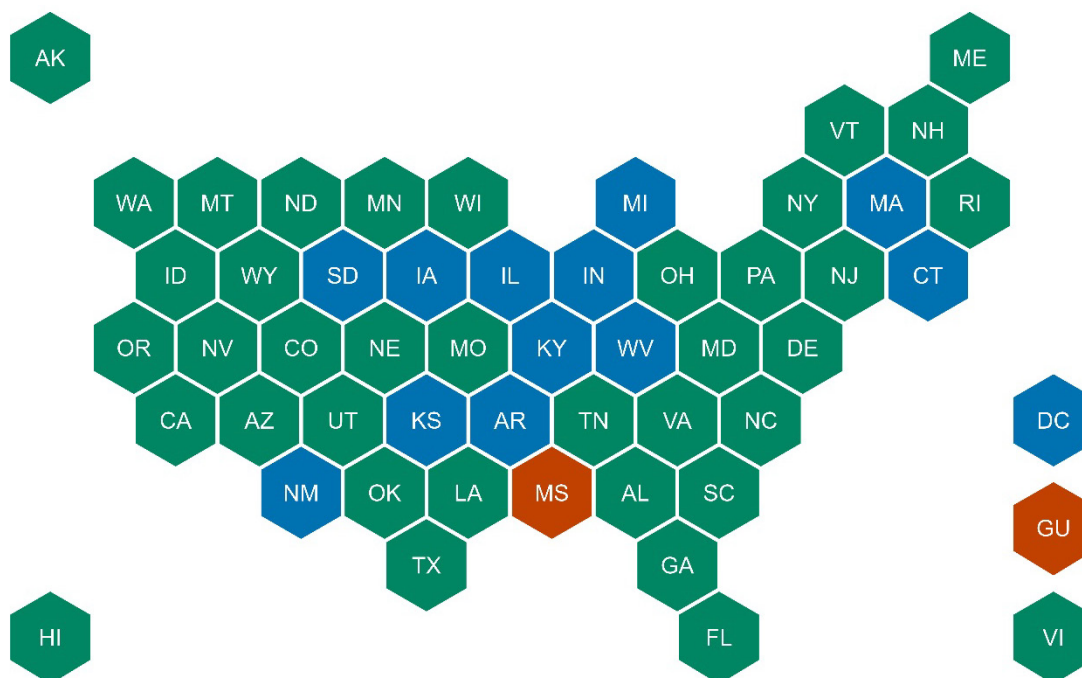

Work Requirements: Option to Disqualify the Entire Household

Section 6(d)(1)(B) | 273.7(f)(5)

SNAP household members aged 16–59 must comply with the SNAP general work requirements, which include work registration and a requirement to accept a suitable job if offered, restrictions on voluntarily quitting a job or decreasing hours, and potentially mandatory participation in SNAP E&T or workfare. People are exempt from the general work requirements if they are facing physical or mental barriers to work, caring for a young child or incapacitated person, employed at least 30 hours, or participating in a work program or school half-time or more.

Nonexempt individuals who fail to comply, without good cause, are disqualified (see SNAP Option Profile *Work Requirements: Disqualification Period Policy*). State agencies have the option to disqualify the entire household if the household member who failed to comply is the designated head of household.

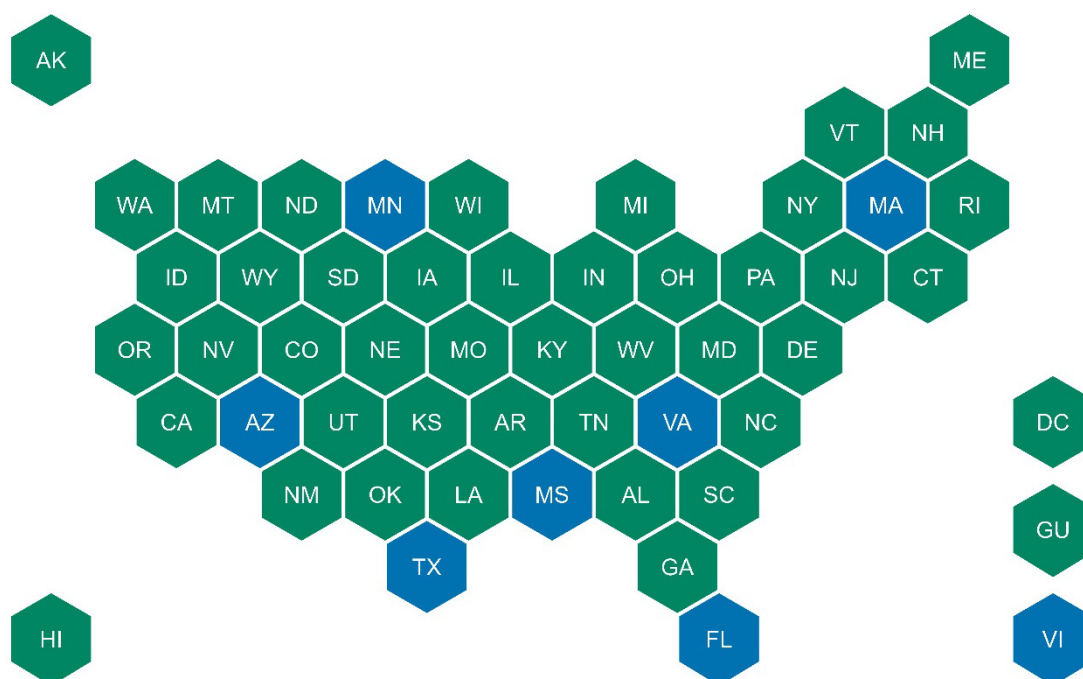

Voluntary and Mandatory SNAP Employment and Training Programs

Section 6(d)(4)(G) | 273.7(e)(5)(i)

State agencies are required to operate SNAP E&T programs. However, States have significant flexibility in the types of programs they offer and the types of SNAP participants they serve. State agencies take one of the following options:

- offer SNAP E&T to certain household members on a voluntary basis;
- mandate that certain household members participate in SNAP E&T to maintain SNAP eligibility and offer voluntary participation to others; or
- mandate that certain household members participate in SNAP E&T to maintain their SNAP eligibility without offering voluntary participation to others.

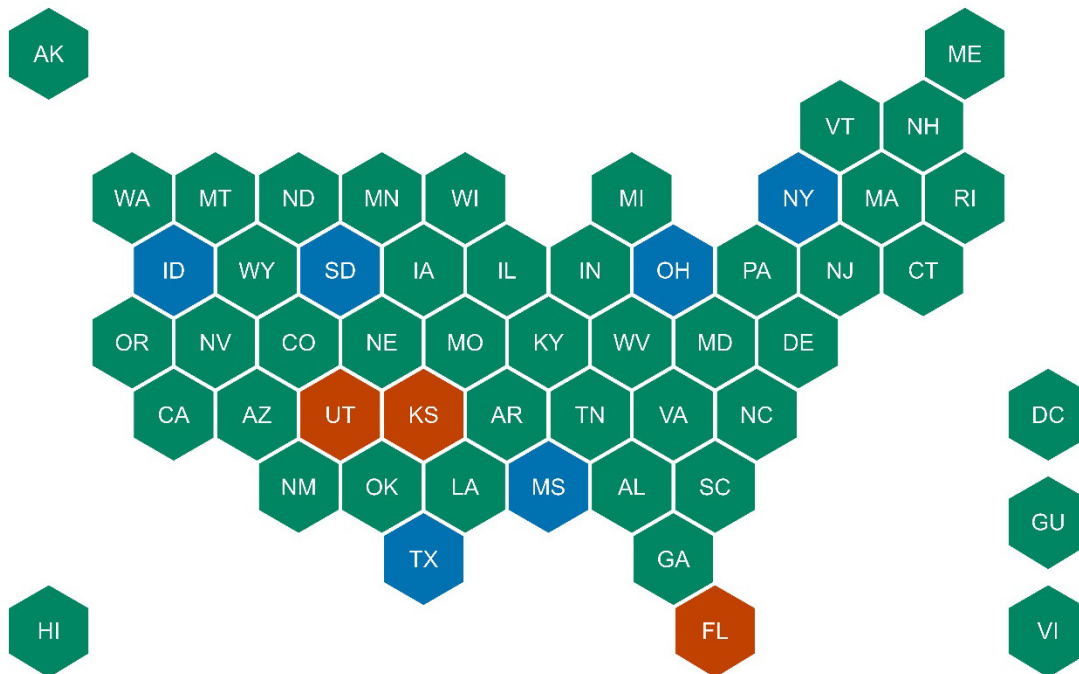

ABAWD Time Limit Waiver

Section 6(o)(4)(A) | 273.24(f)

An ABAWD is a person aged 18–52 who does not meet any of the exemption criteria set by Federal law. People are not considered ABAWDs if they are exempt from the SNAP general work requirements, share a household with a person younger than 18, are pregnant, are experiencing homelessness, are a veteran, or were in foster care at 18 (or higher age if the State offers extended foster care) and are still younger than 25. In addition to the SNAP general work requirements, ABAWDs must work and/or participate in a work program at least 80 hours per month or participate in workfare to receive SNAP for more than 3 months in a 3-year period. State agencies have the option to request a waiver of this restriction in areas with an unemployment rate above 10 percent or a lack of sufficient jobs. FNS generally approves waivers for a 12-month period. Implementation periods are not required to align with the Federal fiscal year or quarter, and State agencies may choose to discontinue a waiver prior to its expiration. An ABAWD time limit waiver does not waive the SNAP general work requirements.

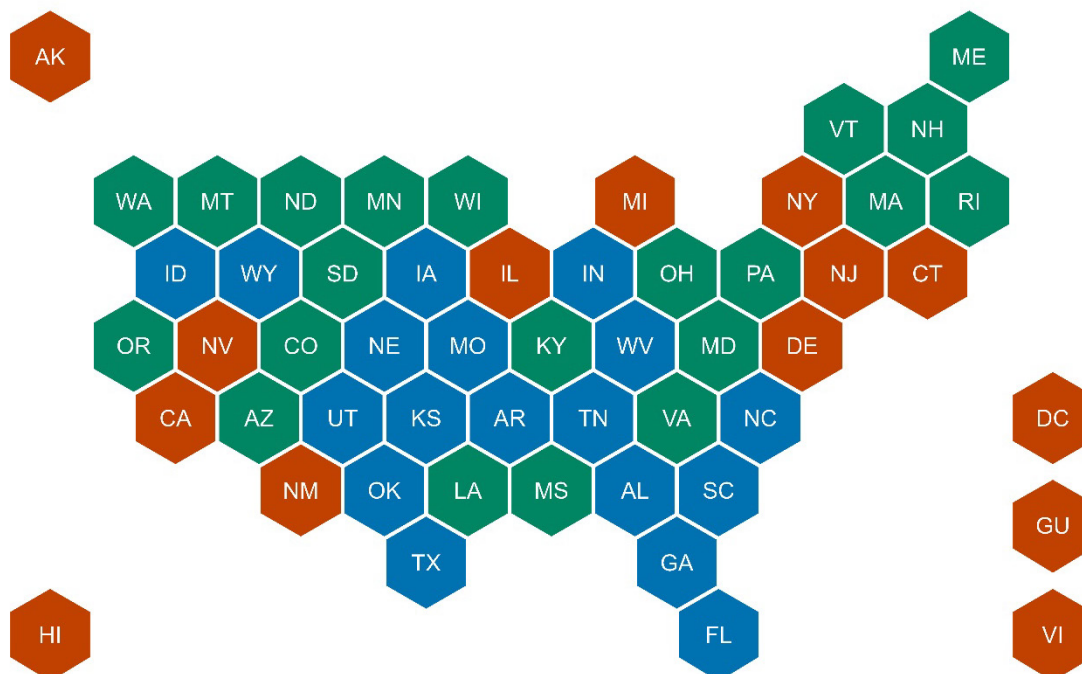

ABAWD Discretionary Exemptions

Section 6(o)(6) | 273.24(g)

An ABAWD is a person aged 18–52 who does not meet any of the exemption criteria set by Federal law. People are not considered ABAWDs if they are exempt from the SNAP general work requirements, share a household with a person younger than 18, are pregnant, are experiencing homelessness, are a veteran, or were in foster care at 18 (or higher age if the State offers extended foster care) and are still younger than 25. ABAWDs must work and/or participate in a work program at least 80 hours per month, or participate in workfare, to receive SNAP for more than 3 months in a 3-year period. In addition to the option to request to waive this restriction, the law provides each State agency with a limited number of discretionary exemptions. State agencies can use these exemptions to extend SNAP eligibility for individual ABAWDs on a monthly basis. Some agencies choose to use discretionary exemptions, while others do not. State agencies with statewide ABAWD waivers do not use discretionary exemptions. The data displayed are based on State agencies' use of discretionary exemptions in FFY 2023.

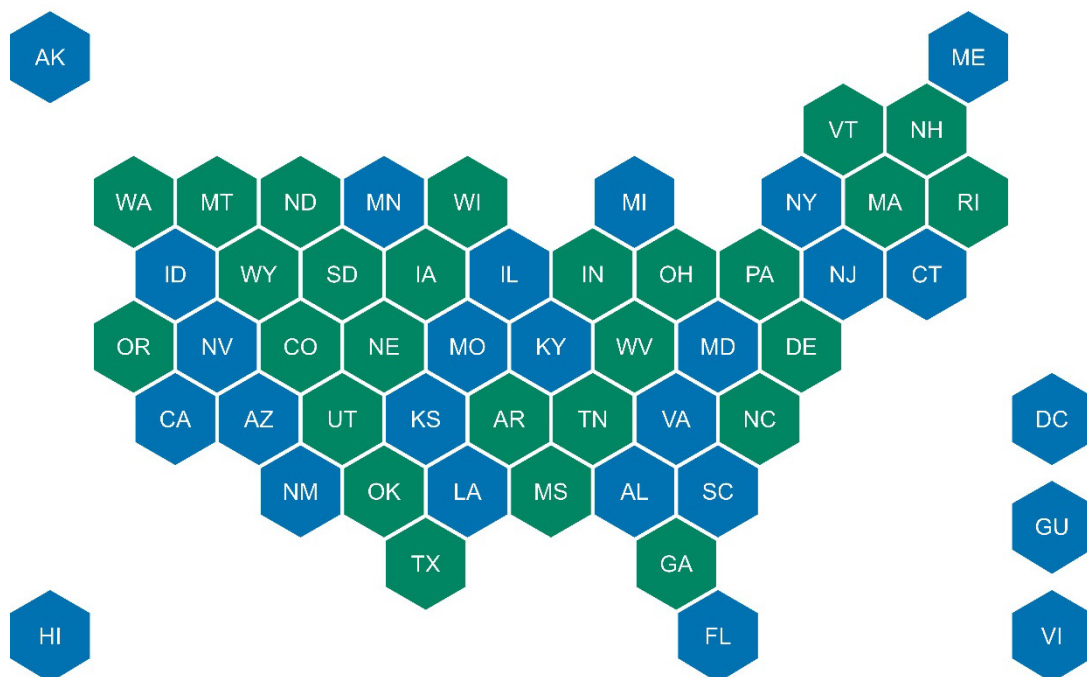

Broad-Based Categorical Eligibility

Section 5(a) | 273.2(j)(2)(ii)

By law, households that receive cash benefits from another means-tested program such as Supplemental Security Income (SSI), TANF, or General Assistance are categorically eligible for SNAP. State agencies also have the option of adopting broad-based categorical eligibility (BBCE), which expands categorical eligibility to households that receive noncash benefits funded by TANF or Maintenance of Effort funds. Under BBCE, State agencies may align their asset and gross income limits with the TANF noncash benefit program that confers categorical eligibility. BBCE households must meet all other SNAP rules to be eligible.

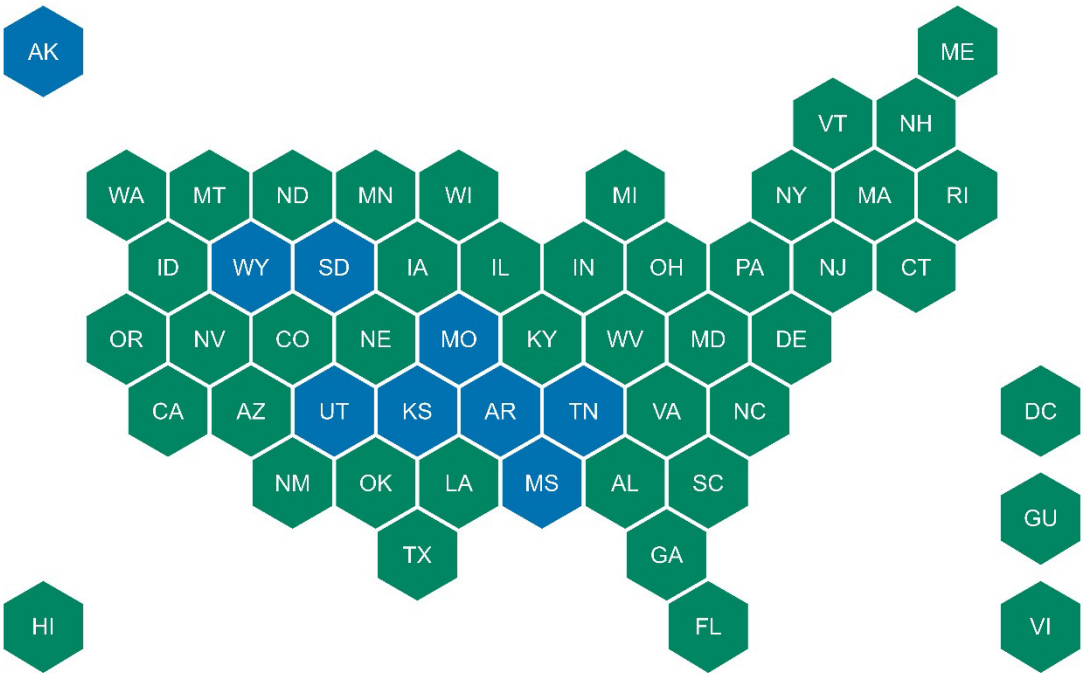

Transitional Benefits Alternative

Section 11(s) | 272.2(d)(1)(xvi)(J) | 273.26

State agencies have the option to offer Transitional Benefits Alternative (TBA) SNAP benefits to households leaving TANF or State-funded cash assistance programs. TBA provides households with a set benefit amount and eliminates reporting requirements during the transition period. Benefits can be continued for up to 5 months at a level equal to the amount the household received prior to TANF termination, with adjustments for the loss of TANF income. Certification periods may be extended for households to receive the full 5 months of benefits. State agencies may exclude from TBA households in which all members are ineligible to receive SNAP benefits for the following reasons:

- They fail to comply with laws related to a means-tested program.
- They fail to cooperate with child support agencies.
- They are delinquent in court-ordered child support.

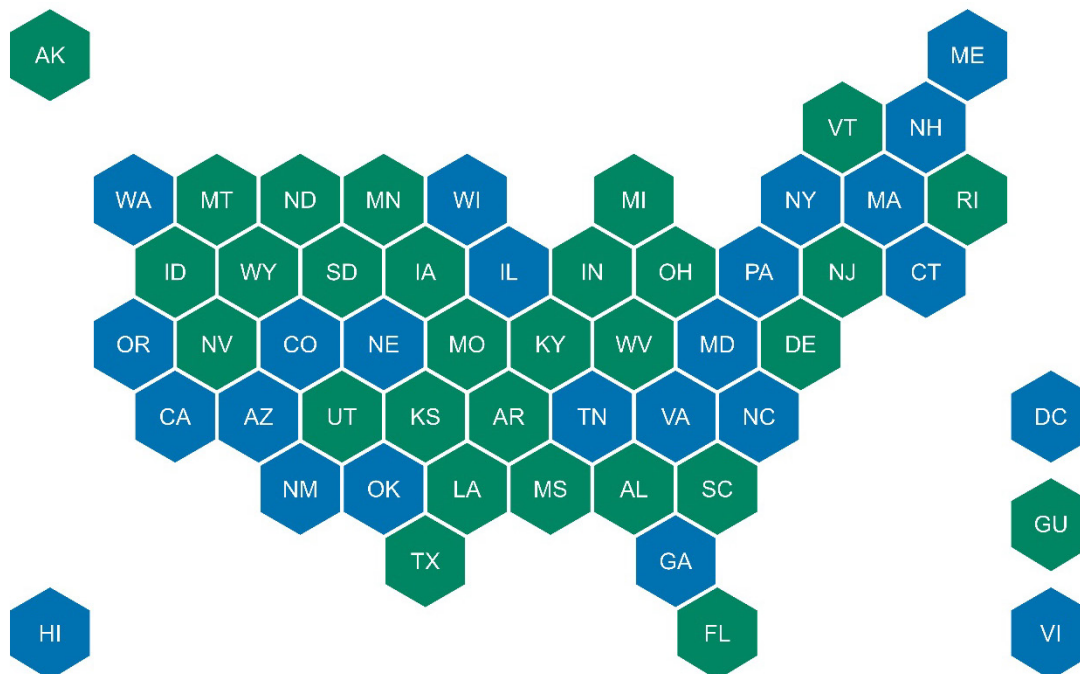

Section 17(b)(1)(A)

The Elderly Simplified Application Project (ESAP) is a SNAP demonstration project focused on households with adults aged 60 or older and people with disabilities. ESAP streamlines the application and certification process by simplifying the verification process, providing 36-month certifications, and waiving the recertification interview. ESAP serves households that do not have earned income and in which all adult members are aged 60 or older and/or have a disability. All demonstration projects are required to be evaluated.

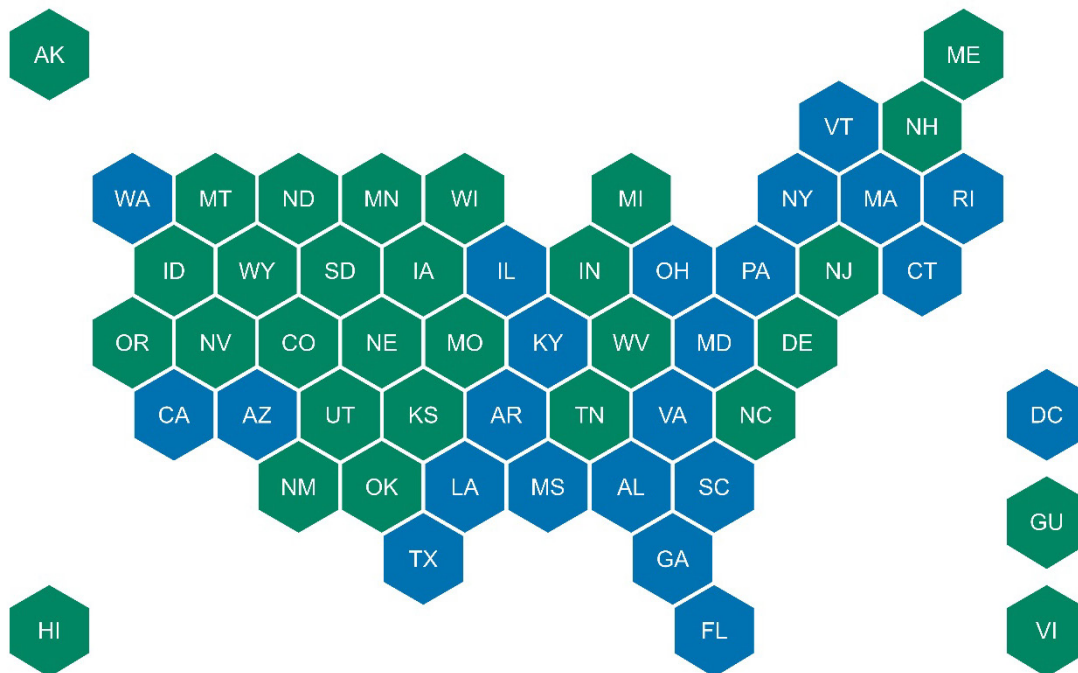

Standard Medical Deduction Project

Section 17(b)(1)(A)

The Standard Medical Deduction (SMD) is a SNAP demonstration project focused on households with adults aged 60 or older and people with disabilities. SMD simplifies the excess medical expense deduction by allowing State agencies to establish a standard deduction amount for certain households. SNAP households with an adult aged 60 or older and/or a person with a disability are entitled to a deduction from their household income of allowable, out-of-pocket medical expenses those individuals incurred over \$35 a month. The SMD allows agencies to streamline administrative procedures, reduce the paperwork burden on older adults and individuals with disabilities, and simplify the process of claiming this deduction. Households may opt to claim actual medical expenses if they are greater than the SMD. All demonstration projects are required to be evaluated.

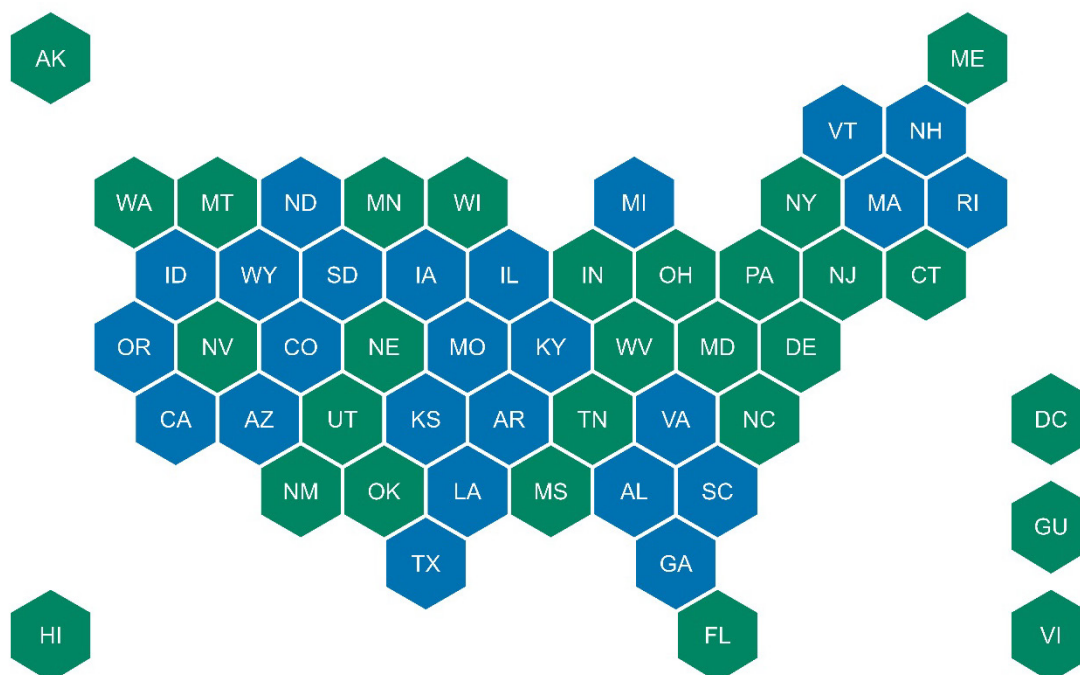

Combined Application Projects

Section 17(b)(1)(A)

Combined Application Projects (CAPs) are SNAP demonstration projects that involve collaboration among the Social Security Administration (SSA), FNS, and State and local agencies to streamline application procedures for individuals receiving SSI benefits. CAPs are available in two models: standard and modified. The standard model includes simplified joint SNAP/SSI application processing by SSA as individuals apply for or are recertified for SSI. The modified model uses data from SSA to send eligible SSI households simplified SNAP applications. Both models use standard SNAP benefit amounts and/or shelter expenses in the benefit calculation. All demonstration projects are required to be evaluated.

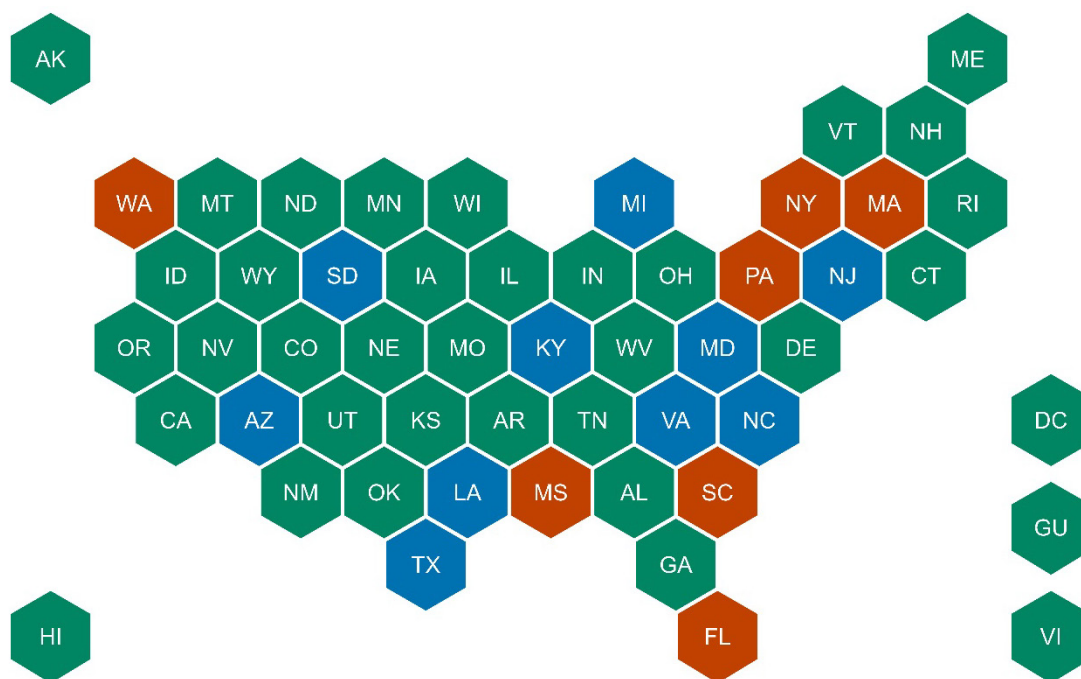
